WINDHAM FABRICS

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 Featuring the Catch of the Day Collection by Pela Studios
 Size 70" x 58"
 Quilt or Table Cover or Wall Hanging or Picnic Blanket!
 1/4" seams allowed unless otherwise noted.

Borders #2 and #4 are cut on the lengthwise grain of the fabric. The border measurements given are exact. Allow a little extra for differences in piecing. Use spray starch on the sashing and narrow borders to help stabilize the pieces.

SAMPLE	KEY/ SKU	QTY	PLACEMENT IN THE QUILT
	36339P-X	4 "motifs"	Quilt Center - Cut 4 panels 18 1/2" x 12 1/2". Be careful to leave the same amount of "edging" on all four.
	36343-X	1 1/2 yards	Border #2 - Cut 2 pieces 44" x 5 1/2". Cut 2 pieces 32" x 5 1/2".
	36344-4	3/8 yard	Sashing - Cut 4 strips 2" wide. From these cut 6 pieces 18 1/2" long and 6 pieces 12 1/2" long.
	36341-2	1/8 yard	Cornerstones for borders #1 and #3 - Cut 1 strip 2" wide. From this cut 8 - 2" squares.
	36342-2	1 3/4 yards	Border #4 - Cut 2 pieces 57" x 7 1/4". Cut 2 pieces 45" x 7 1/4".
	36342-1	1/2 yard	Cornerstones for borders #2 and #4 - Cut 4 - 7 1/4" squares and 4 - 5 1/2" squares.
	36344-2	1/2 yard	Binding - Cut 7 strips 2 1/2" wide. Seam together diagonally. Press in half.
	36340-1	1/2 yard	Borders #1 & #3 - Cut 9 strips 2" wide. Seam together diagonally. Cut 2 strips 54" long, 2 strips 42" long for border #3. Cut 2 strips 41" and 2 strips 29" for border #1.
	36340-2	1 3/4 yards	Backing - Cut into 2 pieces across the fabric. Seam along selvedge edge. Press seam to one side.

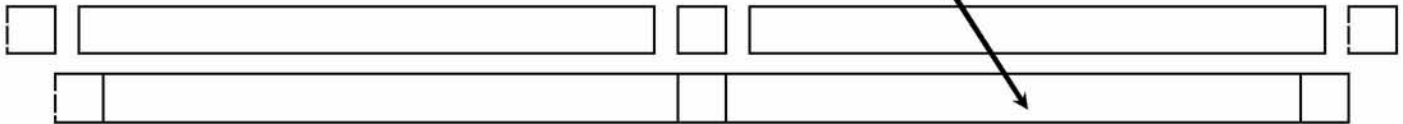
Quilt construction

Note: Some strips are not very wide. Starch your fabric before cutting to help with stability.

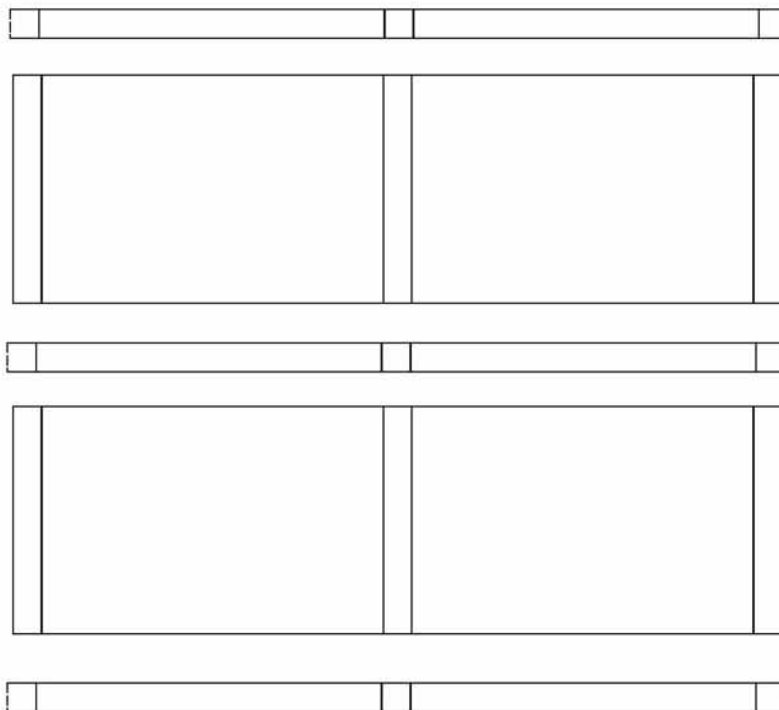
1. Sew sashing to both sides of two of the panels. Sew sashing to the right side of the last two. Sew two panels together to create one row. Make two panel rows.



2. To make a sashing row, sew a cornerstone, a sashing piece, a cornerstone, a sashing piece, and finish with a cornerstone. Make 3 sashing rows.



3. Sew a sashing row to the top and the bottom of a panel row.
4. Add the next panel row.
5. Finish with a sashing row.



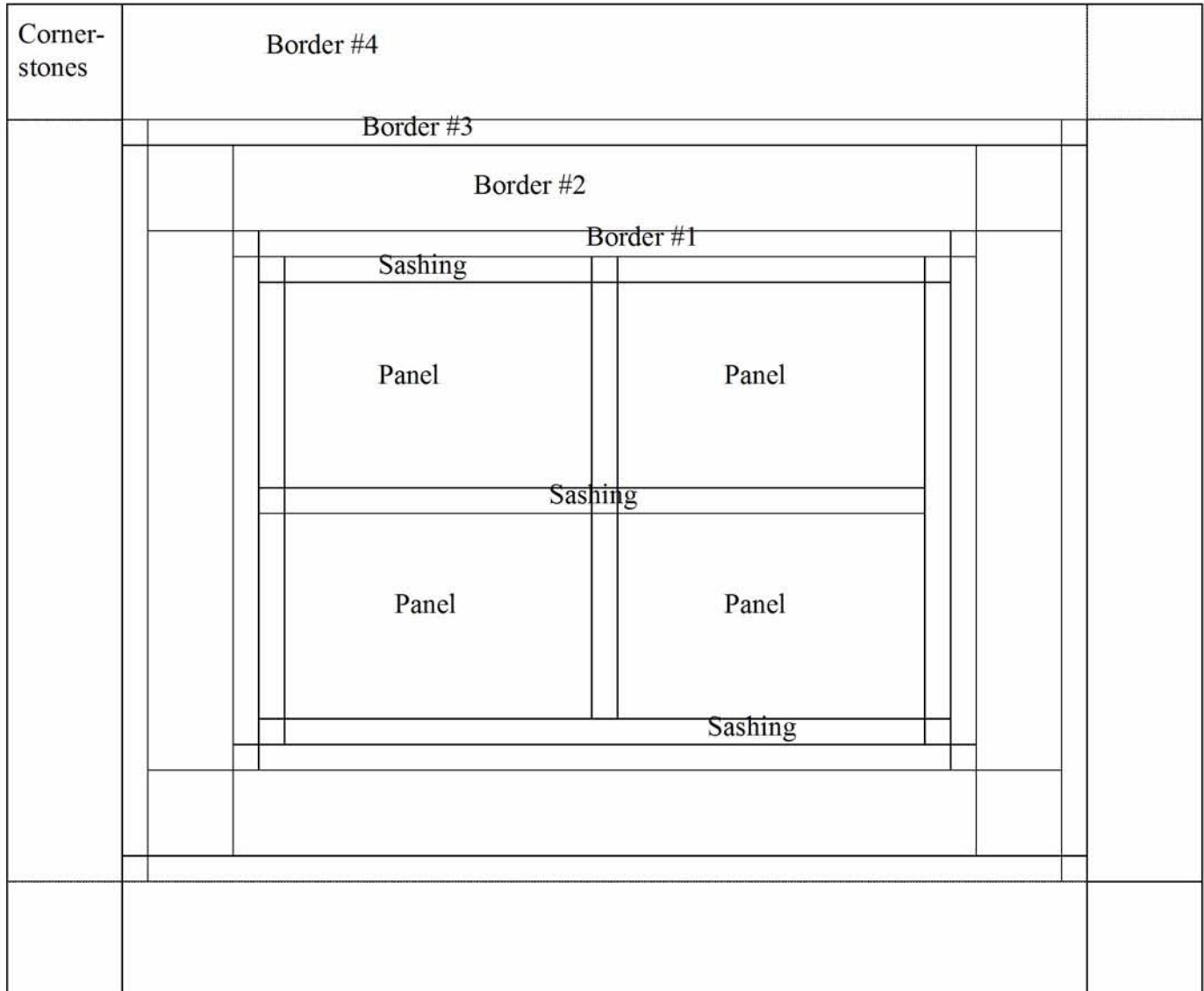
6. Following the same idea around the edge of the center panel, add borders to the sides, add cornerstones to the top and bottom borders. Finish the border by adding the top and borders.

7. Repeat this procedure for all four borders.
8. After the borders have been set, press the quilt well and create your sandwich of top, batting, and backing. If you are intending on using the quilt as a tablecloth, you might want to consider using a thermal batting to protect the table underneath.
9. Quilt as desired.
10. Trim the edges and bind using a 3/8" seam allowance.
