

Paper-backed light fusible web (15" wide): 3 yds




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Cutting instructions:

- 1. From the Camp print fabric (40864-X), cut (1) rectangle measuring 21 ½" X 34 ½ " for background.
- 2. From the Text print fabric (40865-X), cut:
 - (2) rectangles measuring 34 1/2" X 4 1/2"
 - (2) rectangles measuring 29 1/2" X 4 1/2"

Set aside the rest for bias binding

*note: because the text print is directional, cut according to the Cutting Diagram below:



Make and stitch the appliqués:

- 1. Print the templates for the Elephant, Sun, and Grass; some templates will need to be taped together along the dotted lines (this is indicated on the templates). Templates have already been reversed for tracing onto fusible web.
- 2. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the templates onto the paper-backed fusible web. Copy the color recommendations onto each traced template.
- 3. Cut out the traced templates, leaving a 1/4" margin around the edges. If you wish, also cut out the *inside* of each template about $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the traced lines (this will reduce bulk and stiffness in the finished wall hanging).
- 4. Following the manufacturer's instructions, fuse the traced templates to the **wrong** side of each appliqué fabric.
- 5. Using very sharp scissors to minimize fraying, cut out the fabric shapes along the traced lines.
- 6. Following the Placement Diagram, place the appliqués on the Camp print background rectangle. Remove the paper backing from the fusible web and pin each appliqué in place as you go. Appliqué pieces will overlap one another.



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- 7. For the elephant appliqué, cut slits in the head as indicated on the template. Tuck the mouth and tusk appliqués under these slits so that the trunk overlaps them.
- 8. When you are satisfied with your layout, use an iron to permanently fuse the fabric shapes to the background, again following the manufacturer's instructions (remember to remove pins before fusing!)
- 9. Stitch around each shape to secure to background. A zig-zag or machine blanket stitch can be used, using matching thread or invisible thread. A straight stitch can also be used, although this will result in more fraying of the appliqué fabrics along their edges.




Attach the borders:

- 1. Stitch (1) 34 ½" X 4 ½" Text print rectangle to each side of the appliquéd background; take care to ensure the text faces up relative to the appliqués.
- 2. Stitch (1) 29 $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Text print rectangle to the top and bottom of the appliquéd background; take care to ensure the text faces up relative to the appliqués and the lower edges of the Grass appliqués are caught in the seam.



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



Finish the quilt

1. Layer, baste, and quilt as desired. Bind using your favorite method.
